ABOR to Convene First University of Arizona Presidential Search Advisory Committee Meeting

WHAT: The University of Arizona Presidential Search Advisory <u>Committee</u> will meet to review the status and progress of the search process thus far and to discuss essential leadership characteristics and qualities for the next UA president. <u>R. William Funk and Associates</u>, a search firm that specializes in higher education executive recruitment with more than 400 searches conducted, will share their perspective on the search environment in the context of the national landscape, and the committee

will discuss the search committee's role, code of conduct and protocols.

Additional discussion items include providing instructions to the committee on Arizona's open meeting and public records law during the presidential search, and the committee will follow established presidential <u>search guidelines</u> as the selection process for the next University of Arizona president continues.
